Free Pumpkins!

Thanks to a generous farmer/doner, Kindergarten and first grade students who are present at school will receive a free pumpkin October 20th. Pumpkins will be going home with your child at the end of the day.



Another year, another October. Time goes fast. Our weather is definitely chilling and as I am looking out the window today... also, wet. I love getting to see all of our students at school working on different projects, playing with friends and learning. We have some great kids. As the season is changing, students will need to adjust their clothing for the colder season (long-sleeves, jackets, pants and closed-toe shoes).

This last month I have been going into classrooms on Fridays to teach our students about bullying. These lessons will continue throughout the whole year. When we talk to kids about bullying we explain to them the criteria for a bully. A bully is someone who intentionally hurts someone else's body or feelings; does these types of unkind things more then once; and that it is one-sided meaning they are doing the unkind things to them and the victim has done nothing wrong/unkind. It is also really important that when this happens that students tell an adult right away.

Sometimes as we go through life we end up facing obstacles and challenges. Having resilience is a group of coping skills that can be taught to help us to persevere and make it through those difficult times. Teaching resilience to kids starts with you and with adults. Caren Baruch-Feldman and Rebecca Comizio say it best, "Just like flight attendants instruct adults passengers to put their oxygen masks on first, it's important for you to learn how to cope with stress and deal with setbacks in your own life before you help a child build these skill" (*The Resilience Workbook for Kids*, 2022, p. xi). Some skills that we as adults can use and also teach our kids are naming our emotion (e.g. I am feeling sad, etc.); using positive self-talk or writing self affirmations down (e.g. I can do this! Or I am going to have a good day! Or I am doing my best! etc.); and developing an attitude of gratitude (e.g. I am thankful for the rain providing moisture in the ground, etc.). There are lots more strategies that can be used as coping skills that make up resilience. You can find some of them here... (https://www.apa.org/topics/resilience/building-your-resilience).

Wednesday – 7pm-8pm for the migrant meeting




