The winter holidays often bring fun and generate a great deal of excitement in children. However, the busy schedules, change in routine, and added excitement can also increase their stress and anxiety. As we look forward to our return to school in January, we will be focusing on re-establishing routines and reminding students of our schoolwide ROAR expectations. These expectations will be explicitly taught to students in all areas of the school (cafeteria, playground, classroom, etc.) through our **Expectations Fair.**

After getting back into the school routine, students will be taking their mid-year **NWEA tests** to measure progress and help teachers plan for future instruction.

We will also begin our schoolwide Second Step theme on **emotion management**. In our morning announcements and school assembly we'll be prompting students to notice their own feelings by paying attention to clues in their bodies, and we'll be reminding them to use their Second Step skills to calm down:

- Stop—Use your signal
- Name your feeling
- Calm down: Breathe, count, use positive self-talk

These skills help students calm down strong emotions when faced with learning and social challenges, which helps them succeed academically and get along well with others.

Second Step lessons specifically teach about calming down strong emotions such as anger, disappointment, frustration, and anxiety. You'll be receiving Home Links that describe why managing strong emotions is important and include fun activities to do with your child to help him or her identify strong feelings and calm down. We hope the Home Links will give you tools to use together when your child is upset.

In closing, I want to encourage you to save the date of our *First Friday Coffee* of the new year! It will be held on January 10th at 8:45 am. This is a time to meet with me and discuss questions, ideas, or concerns you may have. I appreciate feedback from parents and always enjoy the conversation.
