I also want to make you aware that there will be no school on March 25th to provide an opportunity for teachers to conference with parents if there are concerns or issues that need to be discussed. Your child's teacher will contact you to schedule a conference if they feel it is necessary. You are also welcome to contact your child's teacher to schedule a conference if you have concerns you would like to discuss.
