Happy Winter!

I hope that everyone is coming back from a restful and enjoyable Thanksgiving holiday. Thank you to everyone who helped with the District Wide Food Drive. We met and then exceeded our goal! The community support we receive is so impactful. November was a busy month and our students have been working hard. We just finished the second lesson in our Bully Prevention Curriculum and have been discussing the three R's (Recognize, Refuse, Report) to stop bullying. To recognize bullying we have to know that it is hurting bodies or feelings, it has happened more than one time, and that it is one-sided. We always ask students to first refuse the bullying by asking the other person to stop in an assertive voice. If after that the behavior does not stop then we want them to come report to an adult.

Holidays can be an exciting joyful time, but for some the holidays are hard. It might remind you of a loved one no longer with you, financial strain through the holidays, or the shuffling of plans and homes. Kids can also feel this stress. With cloudy days, cold weather and the above mentioned things you may see a change in your child's behavior and mood. There might be increased tantrums, or your child may seem more withdrawn or moody. Sometimes this is also true for adults. So what can we do to help our kids if they are experiencing a harder time?

- Create structure. Have a nighttime routine, set limits on screen time.
- Share the calendar or schedule. If you have a kid who is splitting time between two homes, let them know what that looks like over break and holidays.
- Set time aside for them. It could be as simple as reading a story together, watching a movie, playing cards, or having them help you in the kitchen.
- Create a positive behavior chart. (This cannot only extinguish unwanted behaviors, but also increase self-esteem).
- Talk to them ask how they are doing, acknowledge their feelings without judgment, dismissal or question. (Sometimes allowing them to feel heard is all they really need).
