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December, the last month of the year. We are well on our way into winter and I am looking forward to large amounts of snow to play in. I have snow skied since I could walk and it is one of my favorite winter activities. Last year I started lessons with my older son and I am very excited for him to join me this year on the slopes. It seems to me that time goes so fast. Interesting fact I have learned in this last month during a training I attended is that for every year that goes by, the feeling of how long it lasts is seven times longer for kids than it is for adults. Asking them how they are doing and being there to listen can help kids feel heard, cared for, and allows for them to feel safe to talk about their feelings.

Sometimes as parents even when we are doing all the right things our kids can still have big feelings. Recently my three year old told me, "I am so mad and you hurt my feelings!" and then proceeded to crumple to the floor in tears. Now looking at that scene you would think I did something absolutely terrible, but really, I refused to let him have halloween candy for breakfast. Now as parents we understand that not all times can we give our kids what they want, because sometimes we have to give them what they need. In that moment of him crumpling on the ground where he thought his world was ending, I was innerly impressed with how in tune my three year old is with his feelings. While I acknowledged his feelings and accepted that he was mad and sad - I believe I said something along the lines of, "I'm sorry you are feeling this way" he still did not get halloween candy for breakfast. Bottom line- parenting is hard and it takes a village. If you are struggling with behaviors at home, feel free to reach out to educators, myself, a doctor, or a friend for ideas. We are all in this together.

To end this letter, I hope everyone had a wonderful Thanksgiving break. We are a few weeks away from our longer winter break.
