Last week we held our annual food drive. Thanks to your generosity, we provide food for the Thanksgiving holiday for families in our community! Thanks so much for your contributions.



As always, PTO meets on the Third Thursday of each month at 6:00pm in the Elementary School Library. Our next meeting is December 15th! We hope to see you there!



It's finally time to come pick up your child's cookie dough (and other items)! It will be arriving at the school on Tuesday December 6th. You can come by the Elementary School from 10:30am to 6:00pm to pick up your order in the Gym.

Higher level prizes will be included in your child's box of purchased items, and prizes for 15 items sold or less will be handed out by Kassandra Kauffman when picking up the boxes from the gym. Small orders can be sent home on the bus with children. If your child is in K-2nd grade they can take 2 or less items on the bus, and if your child is in 3-5th grade they can take 4 items or less home on the bus. December. The last month of the year. It is a short month here at school with winter break looming around the corner. Holidays can be an exciting joyful time, but for some the holidays are hard. It might remind you of a loved one no longer with you, financial strain through the holidays, or the shuffling of plans and homes. Kids can also feel this stress. With cloudy days, cold weather and the above mentioned things you may see a change in your child's behavior and mood. There might be increased tantrums, or your child may seem more withdrawn or moody. Sometimes this is also true for adults. So what can we do to help our kids if they are experiencing a harder time?

- Create structure. Have a nighttime routine, set limits on screen time.
- Share the calendar or schedule. If you have a kid who is splitting time between two homes, let them know what that looks like over break and holidays.
- Set time aside for them. It could be as simple as reading a story together, watching a movie, playing cards, or having them help you in the kitchen.
- Create a positive behavior chart. (This cannot only extinguish unwanted behaviors, but also increase self-esteem).
- Talk to them ask how they are doing, acknowledge their feelings without judgment, dismissal or question. (Sometimes allowing them to feel heard is all they really need).

To conclude, I want to take a brief moment and thank you for helping support another successful food drive.
